



NWT Labour Force Activity - **January 2015** -

Statistics Canada estimates that, in January 2015, out of 32,300 residents 15 years of age and older 21,600 persons were employed in the Northwest Territories, representing an employment rate of 66.9%. Among provinces and territories, the Northwest Territories had the third highest employment rate behind the Yukon and Alberta. Nationally, Canada's employment rate was 60.9%.


Although the employment rate was unchanged from last month, it remains below historical rates for January. There were 900 less people employed in January 2015 compared to the same time last year.

Throughout the winter months, the number of persons not in the labour force has been stable, hovering around 8,900 (Figure 1).

2015-003 ISSN-0827-3545 Table 1 shows the employment levels by key characteristics for the month of January since 2013. In January 2015, the overall employment rate for most of the key characteristics was lower than the previous two years. The exception is for Yellowknife, Non-Aboriginal persons, and females, whose employment rates were comparable to January of last year. Decreases in employment were noted for males and those living outside of Yellowknife while the number of females employed has remained stable for the past three years.

There was no change in total employment between December 2014 and January 2015. However, over the past 12-month period, total employment decreased by 900 persons (Table 2). Most of the decline occurred in full-time employment and the service industry.

Information on the territorial labour market is a result of the extension of Statistics Canada's national labour force survey (LFS) to the Northwest Territories. Data presented for the Northwest Territories is based on three-month moving averages, with survey counts rounded to the nearest 100 persons.

Labour force estimates have been revised historically by Statistics Canada beginning with this release.
