



## **NWT Labour Force Activity** - March 2015 -

Statistics Canada estimates that in March 2015, out of 32,200 residents 15 years of age and older 21,700 persons were employed in the Northwest Territories, representing an employment rate of 67.4%. Nationally, Canada's employment rate was 60.2%.

Despite a slight drop from the previous month, the Northwest Territories employment rate was third highest in Canada, after Alberta (68.4%) and Yukon (67.7%)\*. It was the lowest employment rate for March since 2010.



Compared to the previous month, the unemployment rate increased by 0.5 percentage points to 8.1%, the highest since August 2014. The number of those not in the labour force followed historical patterns and was the same as March 2014.

Table 2 shows the number of employed persons and the employment rate by key characteristics for the past three months. Between February and March 2015, there was a decline in the number of employed persons and the employment rate among those aged 15-24 years, females, non-Aboriginals, and people living in Yellowknife.

The overall number of employed persons decreased by 400 between March 2014 and March 2015. While the number of persons working in the public sector increased by 900, those working in the private sector and the self-employed decreased by 700 and 600 persons, respectively.
