



NWT Labour Force Activity

June 2016


OVERVIEW

In June 2016, Statistics Canada estimated that 22,900 persons were employed in the Northwest Territories (NWT). This represents an employment rate of 70.2%. Nationally, Canada's employment rate was 61.5%. Since June 2015, employment in the NWT increased by 3.2% or 700 persons.

Figure 1: Persons Not in the Labour Force and Employment Rate Northwest Territories, June 2014 – June 2016




Despite a small decrease from last month, the NWT employment rate has been on an upward trend since November 2015. Those not in labour force declined for the last two months (Figure 1).

EMPLOYMENT RATES BY KEY DEMOGRAPHIC CHARACTERISTICS

Between June 2015 and June 2016, the employment rate increased by 8.4 percentage points for youths aged 15 to 24 and decreased by 0.6 percentage points for those 25 years and older. Over the same period, the employment rate rose by 3.2 percentage points outside Yellowknife and decreased by 1.1 percentage points in Yellowknife (Figure 2).






EMPLOYMENT BY TYPE OF WORKER, CLASS OF WORKER & INDUSTRY

Compared to June 2015, employment rose by 1,300 jobs in service producing industries, while employment in goods producing industries declined by 400 (Figure 3).
