Consumer Price Index – August 2012


Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates that the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index rose 1.9% from August 2011. By comparison, the annual price increase was 1.2% for Canada, 1.0% for Edmonton and 2.4% for Whitehorse.

Between August 2011 and August 2012, consumer prices rose for almost every major component in Yellowknife, notably a 2.8% increase in shelter and 2.4% increase in transportation. Clothing & footwear was the only exception; all of its subcomponents experienced a price decline from one year ago.

The annual increase in shelter is in part a result of higher electricity prices, which have risen 8.7% since August 2011. While transportation prices have also increased over the last year, they are down from their peak in April due to seasonal pricing for purchasing and leasing of passenger vehicles. A fall in public transportation prices (airlines) also contributed to the decline since April.

More recently, transportation prices were unchanged compared to last

month. An increase in private transportation prices, which includes purchasing and leasing of passenger vehicles, was offset by a decline in public transportation. Overall, Yellowknife prices were unchanged between July and August 2012.

CPI values for Yellowknife and Whitehorse include estimates of price changes for owned accommodation based on the price of rental accommodation. As a result, the all-items indexes published for these centers are not strictly comparable to those for Canada and Edmonton.
