

Consumer Price Index – December 2014

Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates that the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index rose 1.7% compared to one year ago. By comparison, the annual price increase was 1.5% for Canada, 1.7% for Edmonton while prices in Whitehorse declined by 0.1%.

Over the one-year period, consumer prices increased for most major components in Yellowknife with the exception of clothing & footwear and health & personal care. Contributing to the increase was a 3.3% increase in food and a 3.2% increase in alcoholic beverages & tobacco products.

Canada & Yellowknife, 2000 to 2014




Figure 1 shows how prices change from one year to the next based on the 12-month average index. Businesses tend to use this rate for the calendar year (January to December) to adjust salaries or evaluate the prices of their goods and services. Between 2013 and 2014, the calendar year inflation rate for Yellowknife was 1.7%.

Both the Yellowknife and Canadian inflation rates were higher in 2014 than 2013. This is the first year where the rate has been lower in Yellowknife than in Canada since 2010.

CPI values for Yellowknife and Whitehorse include estimates of price changes for owned accommodation based on the price of rental accommodation. As a result, the all-items indexes published for these centres are not strictly comparable to those for Canada and Edmonton.
