Consumer Price Index – February 2012


Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates that the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index rose 3.3% from February 2011. By comparison, the annual price increase was 2.6% for Canada, 2.1% for Edmonton and 2.7% for Whitehorse.

The overall price increase in Yellowknife of 3.3% for February compared to a year ago can be largely attributed to higher prices for the transportation component at 7.3%, and for the shelter component at 4.0%.

On a monthly basis, consumer prices in Yellowknife fell 0.8% between February 2012 and January 2012, the largest monthly drop in over three years. February's decline reflected price decreases for both clothing & footwear and transportation at 2.3%, household operations & furnishings at 1.8%, food at 0.7% and shelter at 0.2%. These lower prices were countered, to some extent, with higher prices for health & personal care at 0.8%, recreation, education & reading and alcoholic beverages & tobacco products both at 0.7%.



CPI values for Yellowknife and Whitehorse include estimates of price changes for owned accommodation based on the price of rental accommodation. As a result, the all-items indexes published for these centers are not strictly comparable to those for Canada and Edmonton.
