OVERVIEW

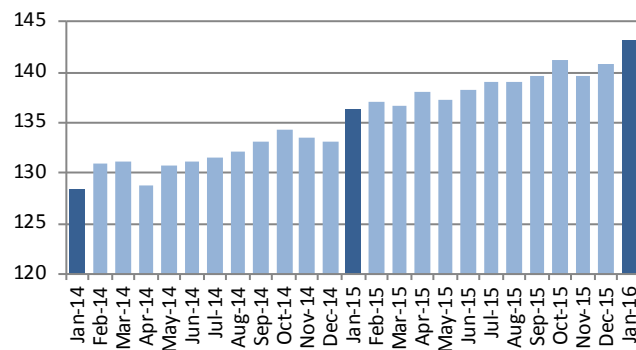
Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates that the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index in January rose 2.0% compared to one year ago. By comparison, the annual price increase was 2.0% for Canada, 2.2% for Edmonton, and 1.9% in Whitehorse.

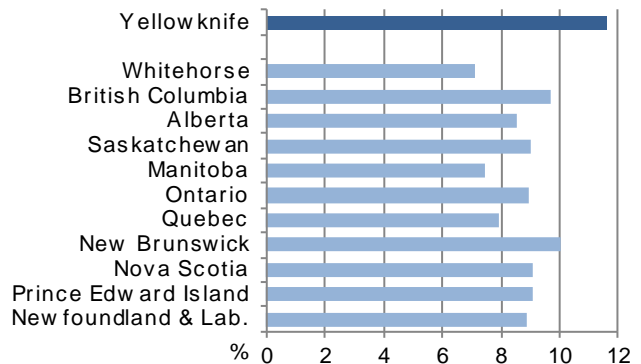

Compared to January 2015, consumer prices increased in Yellowknife for most major components with the exception of shelter. Higher prices for food (5.1%) and transportation (4.3%), were offset by lower prices for fuel oil and other fuels (-20.0%) and gasoline (-4.0%).

Over the last 2 years, there has been an upward trend in the price of food in Yellowknife. While every jurisdiction in Canada has experienced a price rise over this time, the increase has been more pronounced in Yellowknife.
