## **Consumer Price Index – July 2012**


Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates that the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index rose 1.9% from July 2011. By comparison, the annual price increase was 1.3% for Canada, 1.0% for Edmonton and 2.3% for Whitehorse.

Consumer prices rose for every major component in Yellowknife between July 2011 and July 2012. Contributing to the overall increase was a 3.0% increase in shelter and a 2.6% increase in transportation.





The annual increase in transportation is largely a result of higher prices for leasing and purchasing of passenger vehicles. While transportation prices have increased between July 2011 and July 2012, monthly comparisons indicate prices have declined in recent months.

Transportation fell 2.2% between June and July, contributing to an overall 0.2% price decrease in Yellowknife. Also contributing to the monthly decrease were declining prices for clothing & footwear and health & personal care both at 0.6%. These decreases were countered, to some extent, with higher

prices for recreation, education & reading at 1.0%, shelter at 0.3%, food, household operations & furnishings and alcoholic beverages & tobacco products all at 0.2%.

CPI values for Yellowknife and Whitehorse include estimates of price changes for owned accommodation based on the price of rental accommodation. As a result, the all-items indexes published for these centers are not strictly comparable to those for Canada and Edmonton.
