Consumer Price Index – July 2013


Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates that the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index rose 1.8% from July 2012. By comparison, the annual price increase was 1.3% for Canada, 1.9% for Edmonton and 2.1% for Whitehorse.

Compared to July 2012, consumer prices in Yellowknife increased for all major components with the exception of household operations & furnishings. The highest price increases over the last 12 months were for food (4.2%), alcoholic beverages & tobacco products (3.6%) and transportation (3.2%).





While Yellowknife food prices have remained stable in 2011 and 2012, they have trended upward during the first half of 2013. Since December 2012, food prices have increased 5 of the last 7 months, most recently rising by 1.2% between June and July 2013.

Other notable price increases from last month include recreation, education & reading (1.4%) and water, fuel & electricity (1.6%). The price increases

from last month were offset by price declines in clothing & footwear and transportation resulting in no change to the CPI between June and July 2013.

CPI values for Yellowknife and Whitehorse include estimates of price changes for owned accommodation based on the price of rental accommodation. As a result, the all-items indexes published for these centers are not strictly comparable to those for Canada and Edmonton.
