Consumer Price Index – July 2014


Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates that the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index rose 1.7% compared to one year ago. By comparison, the annual price increase was 2.1% for Canada, 2.2% for Edmonton and 1.0% for Whitehorse.

Over the one-year period, consumer prices increased in all major components in Yellowknife. Contributing to the overall increase was a 3.1% increase in alcoholic beverages and tobacco products, and a 2.5% increase in shelter. The largest year-over-year change was a 6.2% increase in the water, fuel & electricity component of shelter.

The price of energy, which includes electricity and fuel oil and other fuels sub-components, increased 4.6%



from one year ago. This was driven by the price of fuel oil and other fuels increasing 9.1% and electricity rising 3.4%. Gasoline prices rose 0.6% between July 2013 and July 2014.

CPI values for Yellowknife and Whitehorse include estimates of price changes for owned accommodation based on the price of rental accommodation. As a result, the all-items indexes published for these centers are not strictly comparable to those for Canada and Edmonton.
