Consumer Price Index – July 2015

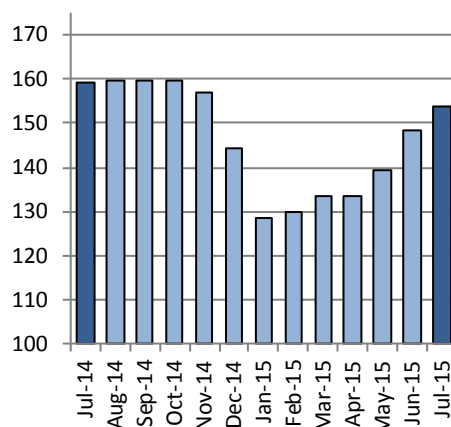
Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates that the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index rose 2.0% compared to one year ago. By comparison, the annual price increase was 1.3% for Canada, 1.3% for Edmonton, and 0.2% in Whitehorse.

Compared to July 2014, consumer prices increased in Yellowknife for most major components with the exception of shelter and health & personal care. Higher prices for food from stores (6.9%) and transportation (2.8%) were offset by lower prices for water, fuel & electricity (-4.7%) and personal care (-3.0%).

On a monthly basis, the overall Yellowknife index decreased by 0.1%; the first monthly decline this year. Contributing to this monthly change were price declines for shelter, household operations & furnishings, and transportation. A notable increase was in gasoline which rose 3.6% between June and July 2015. While the price of gasoline has steadily risen over the last few months, it is still lower than it was last summer.

CPI values for Yellowknife and Whitehorse include estimates of price changes for owned accommodation based on the price of rental accommodation. As a result, the all-items indexes published for these centres are not strictly comparable to those for Canada and Edmonton.
