Consumer Price Index – June 2014

Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates that the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index rose 1.8% compared to one year ago. By comparison, the annual price increase was 2.4% for Canada, 1.6% for Edmonton and 1.0% for Whitehorse.



Over the one-year period, consumer prices increased for most major components in Yellowknife with the exception of clothing & footwear and health & personal care. Contributing to the overall increase was a 3.1% increase in alcoholic beverages and tobacco products, and a 3.0% increase in shelter. The largest year-over-year change was an 8.7% increase in the water, fuel & electricity component of shelter.

The price of energy, which includes electricity and fuel oil and other fuels sub-components, increased 6.5%





from one year ago. This was driven by the price of fuel oil and other fuels increasing 11.7% and electricity rising 8.4%. Gasoline prices rose 0.6% between July 2013 and July 2014.

CPI values for Yellowknife and Whitehorse include estimates of price changes for owned accommodation based on the price of rental accommodation. As a result, the all-items indexes published for these centers are not strictly comparable to those for Canada and Edmonton.
