## **Consumer Price Index – June 2015**


Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates that the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index rose 2.0% compared to one year ago. By comparison, the annual price increase was 1.0% for Canada, 1.5% for Edmonton while prices in Whitehorse declined by 0.2%.

Compared to June 2014, consumer prices increased in Yellowknife for most major components with the exception of shelter and health & personal care. Higher prices for food from stores (6.5%) and transportation (3.1%) were offset by lower prices for fuel oil and other fuels (-23.6%) and gasoline (-6.7%).

## CPI - Yellowknife June 2014 to June 2015



As the graph shows, month over month prices have increased since January 2015. Between May and June there was a 0.6% increase in Yellowknife. Contributing to this monthly change were price increases for transportation, recreation, education & reading and gasoline. The price of gasoline rose 6.5% compared to May 2015.

CPI values for Yellowknife and Whitehorse include estimates of price changes for owned accommodation based on the price of rental accommodation. As a result, the all-items indexes published for these centres are not strictly comparable to those for Canada and Edmonton.
