Consumer Price Index - March 2012

Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates that the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index rose 2.6% from March 2011. By comparison, the annual price increase was 1.9% for Canada, 1.8% for Edmonton and 2.6% for Whitehorse.



The main factors in the 2.6% increase in the All-items CPI for Yellowknife in March were higher prices in transportation component at 6.0%, shelter and alcoholic beverages & tobacco products components both at 3.1%.

On a monthly basis, prices for consumer goods and services in Yellowknife increased by 0.4% in March compared with the preceding month. Price increases at the component level were observed for clothing & footwear at 2.8%, transportation at 1.3%, recreation, education & reading at 0.5% and household operations & furnishings at 0.4%. These higher prices were slightly offset by lower prices for food at 0.4% and health & personal care at 0.3%. The shelter and alcoholic beverages & tobacco products index remained unchanged from the previous month.

CPI values for Yellowknife and Whitehorse include

estimates of price changes for owned accommodation based on the price of rental accommodation. As a result, the all-items indexes published for these centers are not strictly comparable to those for Canada and Edmonton.
