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## **Consumer Price Index**

## **OVERVIEW**

Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates that the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index in March rose 1.7% compared to one year ago. By comparison, the annual price increase was 1.3% for Canada, 1.6% for Edmonton, and 1.0% for Whitehorse.

Compared to March 2015, consumer prices increased in Yellowknife for most major components with the exception of shelter and alcoholic beverages & tobacco products. Higher prices for food (5.4%) and clothing & footwear (6.0%), were offset by lower prices for fuel oil and other fuels (-23.8%) and gasoline (-10.0%).

Canada & Yellowknife, 2000/01 to 2015/16




Figure 1 shows how prices change from one fiscal year to the next based on a 12-month average index (ending March 31). Governments tend to use this annual inflation rate to evaluate the prices of their goods and services.

The fiscal year inflation rate for Yellowknife increased to 1.8% in 2015/16. This was in contrast with the Canadian rate which decreased to 1.2%.
