## **Consumer Price Index – May 2015**


Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates that the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index rose 1.5% compared to one year ago. By comparison, the annual price increase was 0.9% for Canada, 0.9% for Edmonton while prices in Whitehorse declined by 0.6%.

Compared to May 2014, consumer prices increased in Yellowknife for most major components with the exception of shelter and health & personal care. Higher prices for food from stores (6.1%) and household furnishings (6.2%) were offset by lower prices for fuel oil and other fuels (-25.2%) and gasoline (-12.3%).

## CPI - Yellowknife May 2014 to May 2015



As the graph shows, month over month prices have increased steadily since January 2015. Between April and May there was a 0.6% increase in Yellowknife. Contributing to this monthly change were price increases for clothing & footwear, recreation, education & reading and gasoline. The price of gasoline rose 4.3% compared to April 2015.

CPI values for Yellowknife and Whitehorse include estimates of price changes for owned accommodation based on the price of rental accommodation. As a result, the all-items indexes published for these centres are not strictly comparable to those for Canada and Edmonton.
