Consumer Price Index – November 2014


Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates that the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index rose 1.9% compared to one year ago. By comparison, the annual price increase was 2.0% for Canada, 2.0% for Edmonton and 0.7% for Whitehorse.

Over the one-year period, consumer prices increased for most major components in Yellowknife with the exception of clothing & footwear and recreation, education & reading. Contributing to the increase was a 3.8% increase in food and a 4.6% increase in energy.

The price of energy includes the sub-components of fuel oil & other fuels and electricity. The majority of the increase from November 2013 to November 2014 occurred during the winter heating season. Recently, prices have been more stable. Over the last month, the increase in fuel oil & other fuels was mostly offset by a decline in the price of gasoline.

CPI values for Yellowknife and Whitehorse include estimates of price changes for owned accommodation based on the price of rental accommodation. As a result, the all-items indexes published for these centers are not strictly comparable to those for Canada and Edmonton.
