
Consumer Price Index – October 2012

Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates that the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index rose 1.5% from October 2011. By comparison, the annual price increase was 1.2% for Canada, 0.7% for Edmonton and 2.1% for Whitehorse.

Between October 2011 and October 2012, consumer prices increased for most major components in Yellowknife with the exception of household operations & furnishings. The most notable price increases were for alcoholic beverage & tobacco products (3.0%), shelter (2.2%) and transportation (2.2%). The annual increase in shelter is in part a result of higher electricity prices, which have risen 8.7% since October 2011. The increase in transportation is a result of higher prices for private transportation (purchasing or leasing passenger vehicles).

Comparing October 2012 with September 2012, overall prices in Yellowknife increased by 0.4%. This is the first monthly increase since April. Prices rose for most major components over the last month. Most notably, prices increased for clothing & footwear, transportation and food.

CPI values for Yellowknife and Whitehorse include estimates of price changes for owned accommodation based on the price of rental accommodation. As a result, the all-items indexes published for these centers are not strictly comparable to those for Canada and Edmonton.
