Consumer Price Index – October 2015


Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates that the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index rose 2.0% compared to one year ago. By comparison, the annual price increase was 1.0% for Canada, 1.5% for Edmonton, and 0.2% in Whitehorse.

Compared to October 2014, consumer prices increased in Yellowknife for most major components with the exception of shelter and alcoholic beverages & tobacco products. Higher prices for food (5.1%), recreation, education & reading (5.0%) and clothing & footwear (3.6%) were offset by lower prices for fuel oil and other fuels (-22.1%) and gasoline (-9.1%).

CPI - Fuel Oil And Other Fuels Yellowknife, October 2012 to October 2015



Despite an increase of 2.8% from last month, price for fuel oil and other fuel decreased by 22.1% since October 2014. These are the lowest prices since winter 2010.

CPI values for Yellowknife and Whitehorse include estimates of price changes for owned accommodation based on the price of rental accommodation. As a result, the all-items indexes published for these centres are not strictly comparable to those for Canada and Edmonton.
