



## **Consumer Price Index**

October 2016

### **OVERVIEW**

Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates that the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index in October rose 0.8% compared to one year ago. By comparison, the annual price increase was 1.5% for Canada, 0.7% for Edmonton, 1.3% for Whitehorse and 2.2% for Iqaluit.



Compared to October 2015, prices increased in Yellowknife for most major components with the exception of food and health & personal care. The first annual decline in food prices in over 8 years occurred with a -0.3% change from October 2015. As indicated in the graph, food prices in Yellowknife have been on a downward trend since their peak in February.

Comparing September 2016 to October 2016, overall prices in Yellowknife increased by 0.7%. Prices rose for all major components over the last

month, with the exception of food, which remained unchanged from September.
