Consumer Price Index – September 2012


Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates that the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index rose 1.3% from September 2011. By comparison, the annual price increase was 1.2% for Canada, 1.3% for Edmonton and 2.0% for Whitehorse.

Between September 2011 and September 2012, consumer prices increased for most major components in Yellowknife. The most notable price increases were for alcoholic beverage & tobacco products (3.0%) and shelter (2.6%). The annual increase in shelter is in part a result of higher electricity prices, which have risen 8.7% since September 2011. Overall transportation prices have not increased as much as other components due to its two sub-components offsetting one another. Over the last 12 months, private transportation (passenger vehicles) has increased by 2.4% while public transportation (airlines) has decreased by 4.0%.

Comparing September 2012 with August 2012, overall prices in Yellowknife decreased by 0.3%. Prices fell for most major components over the last month; the only exceptions were price increases for clothing & footwear and transportation. This is the fifth month in a row where overall prices have either declined or remained the same. The last time this occurred was in 2003 when prices fell for six consecutive months.

CPI values for Yellowknife and Whitehorse include estimates of price changes for owned accommodation based on the price of rental accommodation. As a result, the all-items indexes published for these

centers are not strictly comparable to those for Canada and Edmonton.
