Consumer Price Index – September 2013


Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates that the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index rose 2.0% from September 2012. By comparison, the annual price increase was 1.1% for Canada, 1.1% for Edmonton and 2.1% for Whitehorse.

Compared to September 2012, consumer prices in Yellowknife increased for all major components. The highest price increases over the last 12 months were for food (3.3%) and transportation (3.1%).





While Yellowknife food prices have increased since the start of the year, they decreased last month falling 2.3% between August and September 2013. This decrease is the largest monthly decline in food prices in over 15 years and reverses most of the increases seen between June and August.

The other notable price declines last month were in public transportation (airlines) and recreation, which decreased 1.8% and 1.6% respectively.

These declines were mostly offset by price increases in many of the other items, resulting in an overall monthly decrease of 0.2% between August and September 2013.

CPI values for Yellowknife and Whitehorse include estimates of price changes for owned accommodation based on the price of rental accommodation. As a result, the all-items indexes published for these centers are not strictly comparable to those for Canada and Edmonton.
