Education

– 2006 Census –

Statistics Canada recently released information on Labour Market Activity, Education, and Language of Work from the 2006 census. The national census is conducted every five years, primarily to count all persons and dwellings in Canada. In the Northwest Territories, the census was undertaken in March and May of 2006. This report presents the sixth in a series of releases based on the 2006 census results.

A few of the highlights for the Northwest Territories from the release include:

- 67% of NWT residents aged 15 years and older had a certificate, diploma or degree.
- 18.4% of NWT residents aged 15 years and older had a university certificate or degree.
- In 2006, NWT women reported a higher level of educational attainment, with 68.5% having a certificate, diploma or degree, compared to 65.6% for males.
- Educational attainment varies considerably by community type: the percentage without a certificate, diploma or degree was 19% for Yellowknife, 29.9% for the regional centres, and 56.5% for the rest of the NWT communities.

It should be noted that changes to the education questions introduced in the 2006 census will result in a loss of comparability with previous census years.

Table 1 presents a breakdown of highest level of educational attainment by province and territory.

2008-006 ISSN-0827-3545 Table 2 presents educational attainment information – those with and without a certificate, diploma or degree – by several select demographic characteristics. While for the NWT overall, 67% of the population 15 years of age and older had a certificate, diploma or degree, there is significant variation in educational attainment across NWT communities.

Looking at educational attainment by community type reveals that the percentage without a certificate, diploma or degree was 19% for Yellowknife, 29.9% for the regional centres (Hay River, Fort Smith and Inuvik), and 56.5% for the rest of the NWT communities.

Comparing educational attainment by gender shows that educational attainment is higher among females in the NWT – 68.5% of females reported having a certificate, diploma or degree in 2006, compared to 65.6% of males.

Comparing educational attainment by ethnicity shows that the proportion of aboriginal persons having no certificate, diploma or degree (54.8%) is significantly higher than the proportion of non-aboriginal respondents (14.1%).

Finally, comparing educational attainment by age group shows that the '15-24' and '55 and over' age groups have the highest reported proportion of respondents without a certificate, diploma or degree. This is expected for the '15-24' age category as most of the cohort aged between 15-18 should still be attending school. Examining the three cohorts between 25 and 54 years of age shows that with increased age comes the increased likelihood of reporting the presence of a certificate, diploma or degree.
