Visible Minorities and Ethnic Origin

— 2006 Census —

Statistics Canada today released information on Visible Minorities and Ethnic Origin from the 2006 census. The national census is conducted every five years, primarily to count all persons and dwellings in Canada. In the Northwest Territories, the census was undertaken in March and May of 2006. This report presents the seventh in a series of releases based on the 2006 census results.

A few of the highlights for the Northwest Territories from the release include:

- In the NWT 2,270 persons reported belonging to a visible minority, accounting for 5.5% of the total population.
- Between 1996 and 2006, the NWT's visible minority population increased by 50%, from 1,515 to 2,270.
- Filipino's accounted for 30% of the visible minority population in 2006; the Filipino population has increased by 75% since 1996.
- In the NWT, 'Aboriginal' (comprised of North American Indian, Inuit and Metis) was the most frequently reported ethnic origin.
- The five specific ethnic origins most frequently reported in the NWT were: North American Indian, English, Canadian, Scottish, and Irish.

Table 1 presents a breakdown of the visible minority population for the NWT and Yellowknife.

For the purpose of the census results on visible minorities, the term 'visible minority' is defined in the Employment Equity Act as "persons; other than Aboriginal peoples; who are non-Caucasian in race or non-white in colour".

2008-008 ISSN-0827-3545 In 2006, Filipino's continued to represent the largest component of the visible minority population, accounting for 30% of all visible minorities and 1.7% of the total NWT population. Between 1996 and 2006, the Filipino population in the NWT increased by 75%. Over the same period, persons identifying themselves as Black increased by 108%, while Southeast Asians (including, for example: 'Vietnamese', 'Cambodian', 'Malaysian', 'Laotian', etc.) and Chinese increased by 82% and 5% respectively.

Table 1 shows that the majority of the visible minority population resides in Yellowknife – at the top end, 94% of Southeast Asians, and at the low end 64% of South Asians (including, for example: 'East Indian', 'Pakistani', 'Sri Lankan', etc.).

Table 2 presents the top 25 reported ethnic origins for the NWT for 2006. In the NWT, 'Aboriginal' (comprised of North American Indian, Inuit and Metis) was the most frequently reported ethnic origin with 15,020 recorded single responses and 7,355 multiple responses (where respondents identified with more than one ethnic category).

The 2006 census enumerated over 6,000 people in the NWT who identified, in whole or in part, as being 'Canadian'.
