Income and Earnings

— 2006 Census —

Today Statistics Canada released information on Income and Earnings from the 2006 census. The national census is conducted every five years, primarily to count all persons and dwellings in Canada. In the Northwest Territories, the census was undertaken in March and May of 2006. This report is the seventh and final in a series of releases based on the 2006 census results.

A few of the highlights for the Northwest Territories from the release include:

- The NWT average personal income was \$44,422, highest in Canada.
- Since 2000, NWT average personal income grew 13.1%.
- Average income for those with a degree higher than a bachelors was \$94,483.
- The occupation with the highest average employment income was management with \$79,848.
- The community with the highest average family income was Norman Wells with \$130,934.

Table 1 shows average income for males and females by province and territory. Males in the NWT had the highest average income in Canada with \$50,648. Among females, the NWT average was second with \$37,828 in 2005. The top female average income was in Alberta. Overall, the Maritime Provinces had lower average incomes.

Table 2 shows the NWT average and median incomes by select characteristics for 2000 and 2005. Incomes are in 2005 dollars. Average income for the NWT has grown 13.1% since 2000.

Looking at income by age group shows people aged 45 to 54 years had an average income of \$61,732, highest among all age groups. Since 2000, people aged 55 to 64 years had the highest average income growth with 21.2%. The table also shows those with higher education have higher average income. In 2005, people with a degree higher than a bachelors had an average income of \$94,483. In contrast, those without a bachelor's degree had an average income of \$38,547. Income also differs by occupation. In 2005, average employment income was highest for those in the management occupation with \$79,848, and least for those in sales and services with \$27,201. Since 2000, average income growth was highest in the health occupation with 24.2%.

Table 3 shows select average incomes for NWT communities. When comparing communities within a region, average income is generally higher in the regional center than outlying communities. Average family income for both Norman Wells and Yellowknife topped the \$100,000, while Inuvik, Fort Simpson, Fort Smith and Hay River all topped \$90,000. In the Tlicho region, Behchokö had the highest average family income with \$82,347.
