

NWT Labour Force Activity

- August 2015 -

Statistics Canada estimates that in August 2015, 24,500 persons were employed in the Northwest Territories, representing an employment rate of 70.8%. This was the highest employment rate in Canada, followed by Yukon (70%), Alberta (69.3%), and Saskatchewan (66%). Nationally, Canada's employment rate was 62.3%.

In the Northwest Territories, key labour force statistics were unchanged between July and August 2015 (Table 1).

Figure 2 shows the employment rate and persons in the labour force for youths aged 15 to 24. Between May and August 2015, youth labour force increased by 1,100 persons, to 4,200 while the employment rate increased by about 16 percentage points to 57.6%. By comparison, the employment rate for those aged 25 years and over ranged between 73.7% and 74.8%.

Northwest Territories, Aug 2014 to Aug 2015**

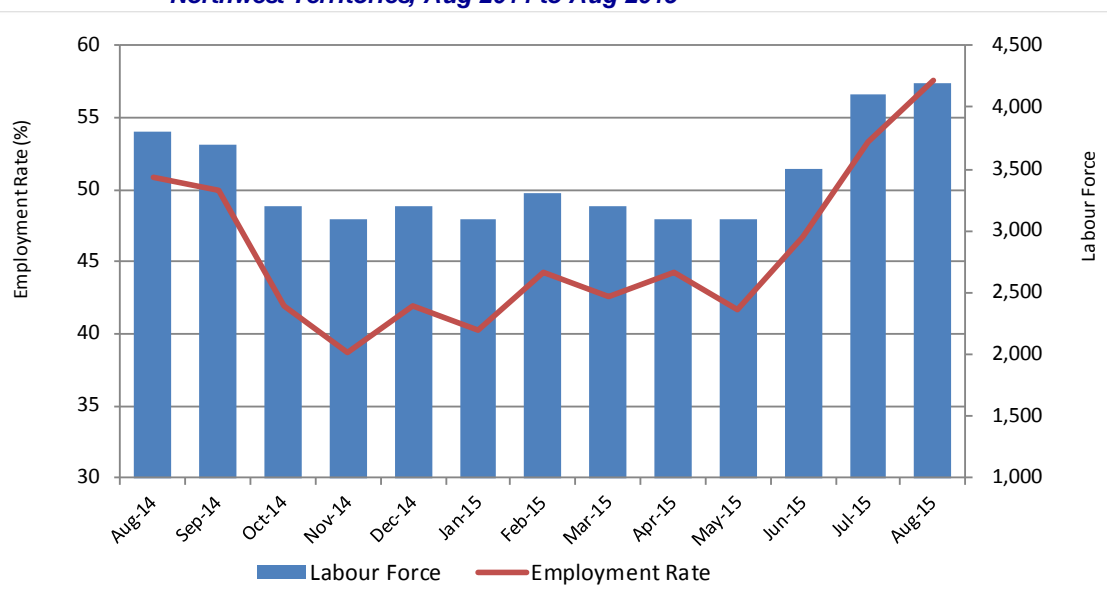


Table 2 shows the number of employed persons and the employment rate by key characteristics for the past three months. While the overall number of employed persons was unchanged between July and August 2015, there was an increase by 200 persons each among those aged 15 to 24, males, Aboriginal persons, and those living in communities other than Yellowknife. The employment rate increased by 4.3 percentage points among youth aged 15–24, while it declined slightly for those aged 25 and over.

Table 3 shows changes in the number of employed persons from the previous month and previous year by selected characteristics. There were little changes in employment by the selected characteristics between July and August 2015. On a year-over-year basis, total employment was down by 200 persons. In August 2015, full-time work decreased by 700, while part-time work increased by 500. Gains in the goods-producing industries were offset by declines in the service producing industries.
