## NWT Labour Force Activity - February 2015 -

Statistics Canada estimates that in February 2015, out of 32,200 residents 15 years of age and older 21,800 persons were employed in the Northwest Territories, representing an employment rate of 67.7%. (Table 1). Nationally, Canada's employment rate was 60.5%.

Since last month, the number of employed increased by approximately 200 persons, resulting in an employment rate increase of 0.8 percentage points. This is only the third monthly increase in the past 12 months, the other two occurring in July and April of last year.

Despite the employment rate increase last month, it remains below historical rates for February.

**Figure 1** *Persons Not in the Labour Force and Employment Rate Northwest Territories, 2013 – 2015*

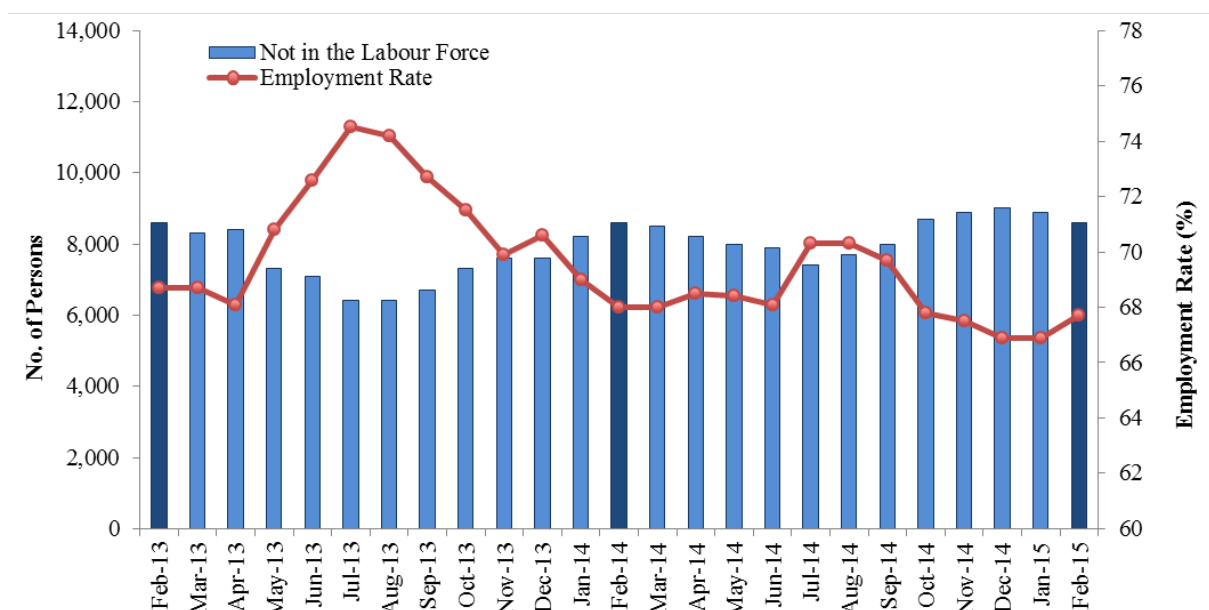


Table 2 shows the number of employed persons and the employment rate by key characteristics for the month of February since 2013. Compared to 2014, employment rates for males decreased by 3.4 percentage points while females increased by 3.1. Similarly, the employment rate for those living outside Yellowknife decreased by 3.2 while those in Yellowknife increased by 3.5 percentage points.

The number of employed persons decreased by 300 between February 2014 and February 2015. While the number of self-employed persons decreased by 500, those working in the public sector increased by 300.
