

NWT Labour Force Activity

April 2016

OVERVIEW

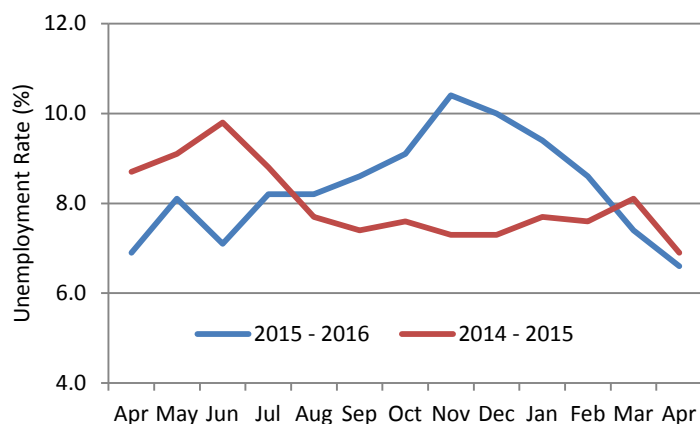
In April 2016, Statistics Canada estimated that 22,500 persons were employed in the Northwest Territories (NWT). This represents an employment rate of 69.4% which was the highest in Canada followed by Yukon (67.0%) and Alberta (66.4%). Nationally, Canada’s employment rate was 60.2%.

Since April 2015, employment in the NWT increased by 4.2% or 900 persons.

At 6.6%, the NWT unemployment rate was lower than the national rate (7.6%) and it has been on the decline for five consecutive months. In 2014 –2015, unemployment rates were lower from August 2014 until February 2015 and more stable.

EMPLOYMENT RATES BY KEY DEMOGRAPHIC CHARACTERISTICS

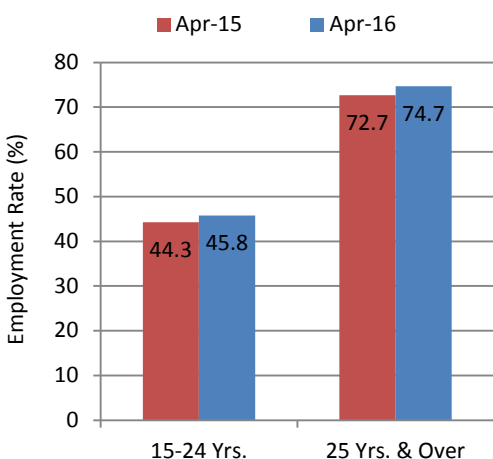
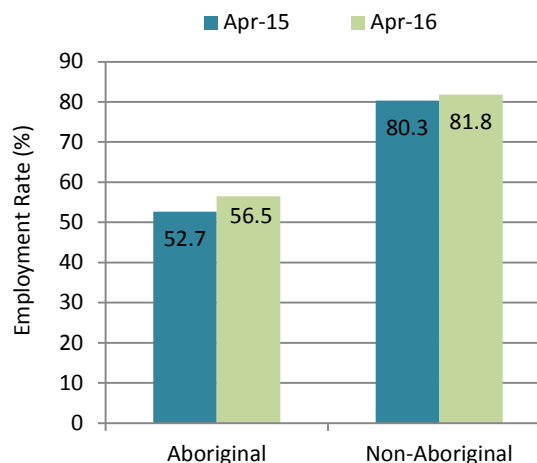


Figure 3: Employment Rates by Ethnicity, April 2015 - April 2016

Between April 2015 and April 2016, the employment rate increased by 1.5 percentage points for youths aged 15 to 24 and by 2.0 percentage points for those 25 years and older. The employment rate among aboriginal persons rose by 3.8 percentage points and the employment rate among non-aboriginal persons rose by 1.5 percentage points during the same period (Figure 2 and Figure 3).

Figure 2: Employment Rates by Age Group, April 2015 - April 2016

EMPLOYMENT BY TYPE OF WORKER, CLASS OF WORKER & INDUSTRY

Compared to April 2015, full-time employment and part-time employment gained 500 and 400 jobs respectively. During the same period, employment in the public sector and the private sector increased by 700 and 400 persons respectively (Figure 4).
