

NWT Labour Force Activity

January 2016

OVERVIEW

Statistics Canada estimates that, in January 2016, out of 32,100 residents 15 years of age and older 22,100 persons were employed in the Northwest Territories, representing an employment rate of 68.8%. Among provinces and territories, the Northwest Territories had the highest employment rate followed by Yukon and Alberta. Nationally, Canada's employment rate was 60.0%.

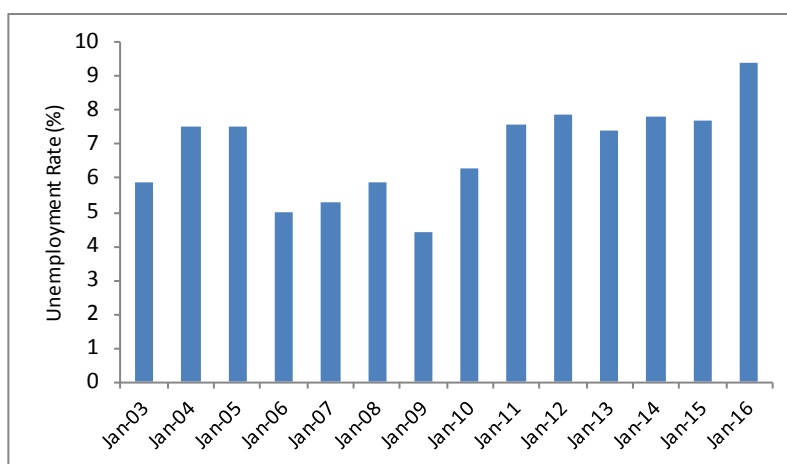
In the NWT, employment rose for the second consecutive month, increasing the number of employed persons by 400 between December 2015 and January 2016. On a year-over-year basis, the number of employed persons increased by 500.

Figure 1: Historical Unemployment Rates for January, Northwest Territories

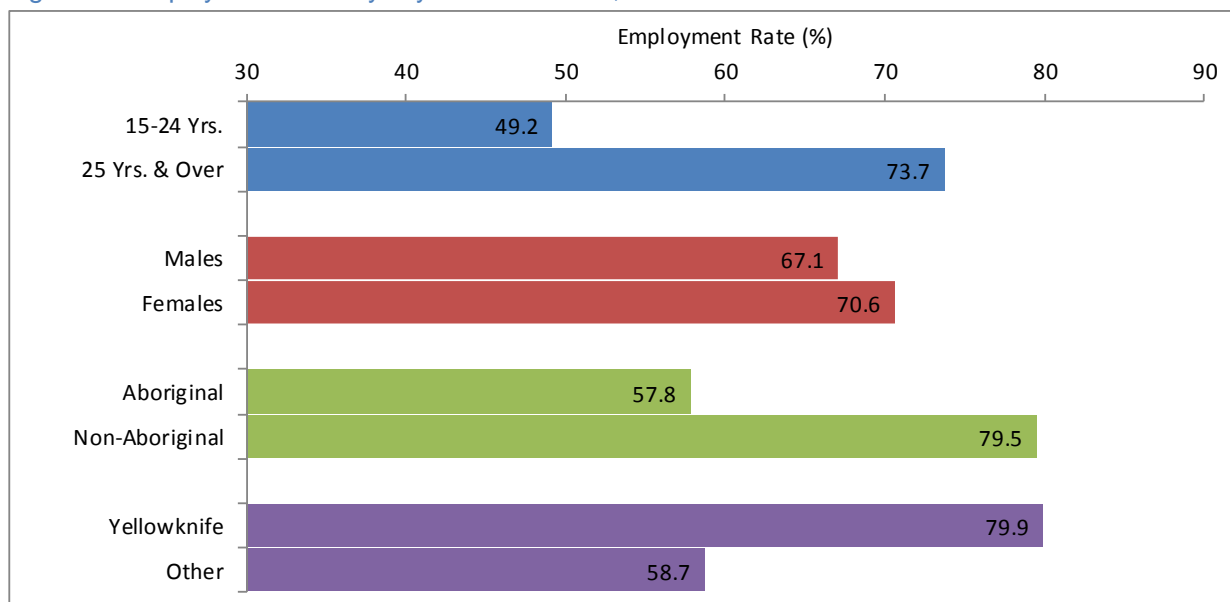
Although the unemployment rate dropped from last month to 9.4%, this was the highest for the month of January since 2003. Compared to the same time last year, there were 500 more unemployed persons in January 2016.



EMPLOYMENT BY TYPE OF WORKER, CLASS OF WORKER & INDUSTRY

In January 2015 employment rates increased for all key characteristics compared to the previous month. Increases among females, Aboriginals, and those aged 15-24 years increased by at least 3 percentage points. Similar to last month, the employment rate among females was higher than that for males.

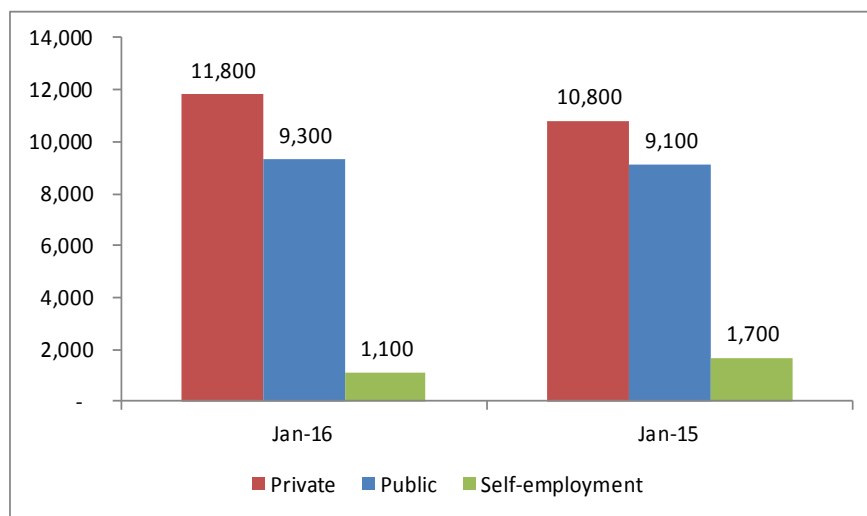
Figure 2: Employment rates by key characteristics, Jan 2016



EMPLOYMENT BY CLASS OF WORKER

Compared to January 2015, employment in the private and public sectors increased by 1,000 and 200 persons, respectively. In contrast, self-employment decreased by 600 persons offsetting overall employment gains.
