

NWT Labour Force Activity

March 2016

OVERVIEW

In March 2016, Statistics Canada estimated that 22,400 persons were employed in the Northwest Territories (NWT). This represents an employment rate of 69.3% which was the highest in Canada followed by Yukon (67.0%) and Alberta (66.6%). Nationally, Canada’s employment rate was 60.1%.

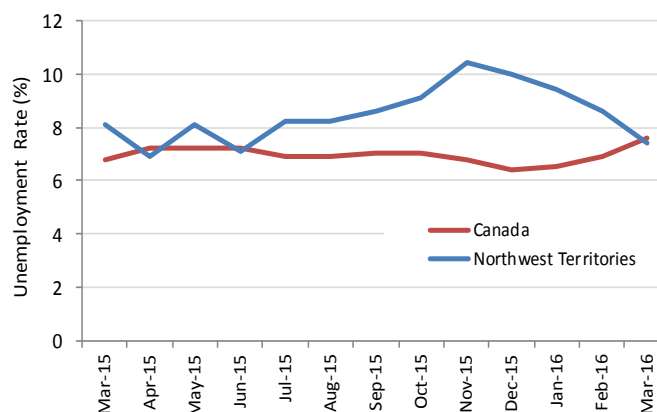
Since March 2015, employment in the NWT increased by 3.2% or 700 persons.

At 7.4%, the NWT unemployment rate was lower than the national rate (7.6%) and it has been on the decline for four consecutive months. There were 100 less unemployed persons in March 2016 compared to the same time last year.

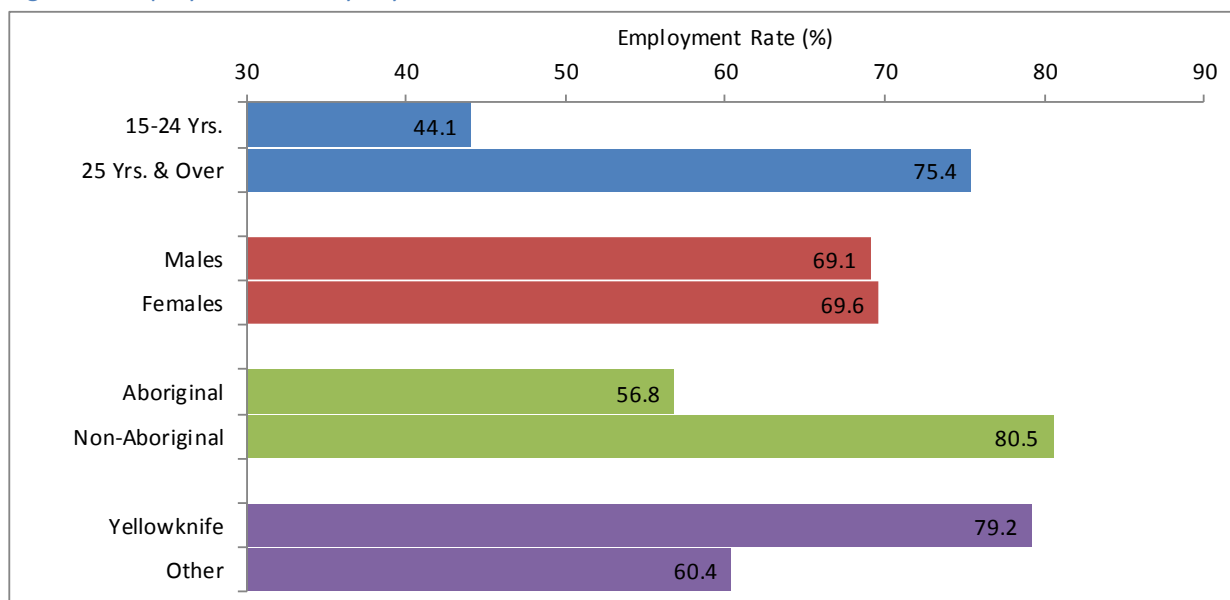
Figure 1: Unemployment rates during past 12 months, Northwest Territories & Canada



EMPLOYMENT RATES BY KEY DEMOGRAPHIC CHARACTERISTICS

Between February and March 2016, employment rates increased for males by 1.4 percentage points, and decreased for females by 1.2 percentage points. For youths aged 15 to 24, the employment rate decreased by 1.7 percentage points and was slightly higher for those aged 25 and over compared to the previous month. There was little change in the employment rates among ethnic and geographic groups.

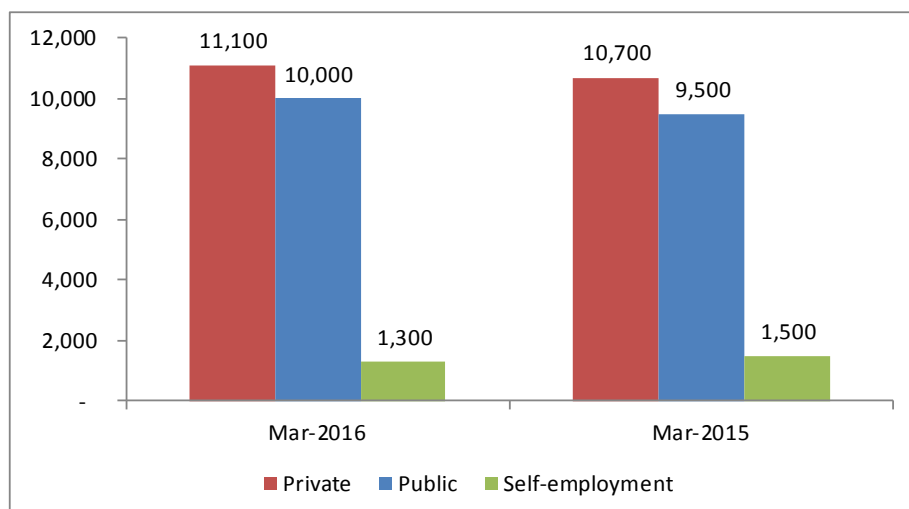
Figure 2: Employment rates by key characteristics, March 2016



EMPLOYMENT BY TYPE OF WORKER, CLASS OF WORKER & INDUSTRY

Compared to March 2015, employment in the public sector and the private sector increased by 500 and 400 persons respectively. Self-employment decreased by 200 persons.
