Labour Force Activity

February 2020

The February 2020 employment rate in the Northwest Territories (NWT) increased slightly to 63.5% from the previous month. Including February 2020, employment rates during the past three months have been the lowest in the territory since those observed in the winter of 2010.

For Canada overall, the employment rate dropped slightly to 61.1% between January and February 2020. During the same period, employment rates dropped for all provinces and territories, except for Manitoba, Nunavut and the NWT.

Employment by selected characteristics

On an annual basis, the NWT labour force shrank by 400 persons, while employment dropped by 600 persons to 20,500. Employment losses were concentrated among youth aged 15 to 24 years, Non-Indigenous persons, and people living in Yellowknife.

Overall, the employment rate dropped 1.6 percentage points from 65.1% in February 2019. Among key demographic characteristics, youth aged 15 to 24 years had the biggest loss, dropping 8.8 percentage points to 34.6%. The employment rate was unchanged for those living outside of Yellowknife, and dropped slightly for Indigenous persons.



Employment by employment type, class of worker, and industry

Most of the employment losses between February 2019 and February 2020 occurred in part-time employment (-400) while full-time employment was little changed. Over the same period, self- employment increased by 500 persons coupled with a slight increase in public sector employment. These gains were, however, offset by a 1,200 person decline in private sector employment.

Year-over-year, employment levels dropped in both the goods-producing industry (-200) and the services-producing industry (-400).
