## Labour Force Activity February 2021

The Northwest Territories' employment rate increased to 66.7% in February 2021 up 1.9 percentage points from 12 months ago. NWT employment rates dropped in the summer months of 2020 in response to measures introduced to contain the coronavirus pandemic, but 2021 employment rates have surpassed pre-COVID-19 levels. Nationally, employment levels saw greater declines due to COVID-19 than the NWT. At 58.4%, Canada's employment rate in February 2021 was 2.7 percentage points lower than 12 months earlier.




Figure 1: Employment Rates, Canada & NWT, Feb 2020 - Feb 2021

## Employment by selected characteristics

On an annual basis, the NWT employment grew by 700 person to 22,600 in February 2021. All of the employment gains were in part-time employment, with 1,200 more people employed. This was partially offset by a 500 person decline in full-time employment. Year-over-year increases were also seen in the public sector. Both the goods and service producing industries experienced gains since February 2020.

## Employment by employment type, class of worker, and industry

Between February 2020 and February 2021, Yellowknife saw a decrease in number of employed persons with all employment gains occurring in the rest of the territory. Females primarily accounted for the gains in employed persons (+800), representing an employment rate of 69.7%, the highest since December 2016. The employment rate also increased 12.7 percentage points compared to February 2020, rising to 50.9% for youth aged 15 to 24 years. The youth employment rate was the highest level in four years.
