Labour Force Activity March 2024

The seasonally unadjusted employment rate in the Northwest Territories (NWT) was 65.7% in March 2024, little changed from last month, and the lowest for March since 2021. Employment stood at 22,600, with 89% of persons working full-time while 11% worked part-time.

Compared to one year ago, employment in the NWT decreased by 4.6% or 1,100 persons, with all declines coming from private sector employment. Consequently, the employment rate in March 2024 was 4 percentage points lower than the 69.7% recorded 12 months earlier. Meanwhile, the unemployment rate slightly dropped to 5.0% as the number of unemployed persons little changed from March 2023.




Figure 1. Employment rates by ethnicity & gender, NWT, Mar 2023 & Mar 2024

Among the major worker groups, year-over-year employment rates declined the most among Non-Indigenous persons, those living outside of Yellowknife, and females. Figure 1 shows employment rate changes by ethnic group and gender, with Non-Indigenous females recording the largest employment rate decline.

Employment by employment type, class of worker, and industry


Year-over-year employment declines were concentrated in the goods-producing sector, overall. Among specific industries, employment decreased the most in construction, trade, and forestry, fishing, mining, oil & gas. Industries recording the largest employment gains were accommodation & food services, utilities, and education.

National highlights

Nationally, Canada's seasonally unadjusted employment rate was 60.7%. Yukon (70.0%), followed by the Northwest Territories (65.7%), and Alberta (64.5%) had the highest employment rates among the provinces and territories. Newfoundland & Labrador had the lowest employment rate at 50.7%.
