Labour Force Activity¹ May 2025

The seasonally unadjusted employment rate in the Northwest Territories (NWT) was 65.0% in May 2025, a decline from 67.2% the previous month. Employment fell to 22,700, with 89.0% of persons working full-time while 11.0% worked part-time.

On an annual basis, the Northwest Territories' employment rate fell by 1.5 percentage points from May 2024. Employment rates fell among most major worker groups with year-over-year rates declining the most among females, individuals living in Yellowknife and persons 25 years & older.




Figure 1: Employment Rates by Key Demographic Characteristics, May 2024 & May 2025

Employment by employment type, class of worker, and industry


Year-over-year employment in the services-producing industry declined by 200 to 19,600, while the goods-producing industry rose by 200, reaching 3,100. Among specific industries, the largest employment gains were in trade (wholesale & retail); forestry, fishing, mining, oil and gas; and business, building & other support services. In contrast, the largest employment declines occurred in education; transportation & warehousing; and finance insurance, real estate & leasing. Overall, employment was little changed from May 2024, decreasing by 100 people over the 12-month period.

National highlights

The employment rate in Canada increased month-over-month from 60.4% in April to 60.7% in May 2025. Among the provinces and territories, Yukon (73.0%), followed by the Northwest Territories (65.0%), and Saskatchewan (63.8%) had the highest employment rates. Newfoundland & Labrador had the lowest employment rate at 51.8%.
