Labour Force Activity

-October 2018-

Overview

The employment rate in the Northwest Territories (NWT) dropped to 67.2% in October from 69.1% in September. Consistent with seasonal patterns the labour force declined 1.7% while employment went down 3.1% during the same period.

Year-over-year, employment in the NWT was little changed, at 21,700 compared to 21,800 last year. There was however a shift from



part-time employment, with 500 more persons working full-time in October 2018.

National Highlights

For Canada overall, the employment rate decreased slightly from the previous month to 61.8% in October 2018. Among the provinces and territories, Yukon (72.5%) maintained the highest employment rate, followed by Alberta (67.4%) and the Northwest Territories (67.2%).

The national unemployment rate was

5.8%, slightly lower than the NWT unemployment rate of 6.1%.



Employment by key demographic characteristics

Compared to October 2017, employment rates declined for all key demographic characteristics with the exception of males and persons living outside of Yellowknife. The highest drop occurred among persons living in Yellowknife and youths aged 15-24, dropping by 3.8 and 3.7 percentage points, respectively. The number of employed persons increased among those 25 years and older, males, Non-Indigenous persons, and persons living outside of Yellowknife.

Employment by employment type, class of worker, and industry

Year-over-year, employment in the services-producing industries was unchanged, while dropping 8.3% in the goods-producing industries. Over the same period, employment increased among public sector workers, while declining among private sector employees and self-employment. October 2018 had the second lowest number of persons in self-employment since April 2016.
