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
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Northwest Territories Population January 2023

On January 1, 2023, Statistics Canada estimated that 45,493 people were living in the Northwest Territories. Between January 1, 2022 and January 1, 2023, the population in the Northwest Territories decreased by 217 persons. The components of natural increase during this period consisted of 546 births and 268 deaths, resulting in a net increase of 278 persons; there was a net loss of 900 interprovincial migrants and a net gain of 405 international migrants.

Historically, Alberta has accounted for the largest number of interprovincial migrants both entering and exiting NWT. In the fourth quarter of 2022, 69 persons moved from Alberta, while 195 persons left for Alberta, resulting in the net loss of 126 persons. The second province that the NWT lost interprovincial migrants to was Ontario with 18 persons moving from Ontario and 107 people leaving for Ontario resulting in a net loss of 89 persons. At the national level, Canada's population increased by 2.7% between January 1, 2022 and January 1, 2023. Higher growth rates were prevalent throughout all the provinces and territories except for the NWT. Prince Edward Island experienced the largest percentage increase followed by Alberta, Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Ontario, and British Columbia all exceeding Canada's growth.
