

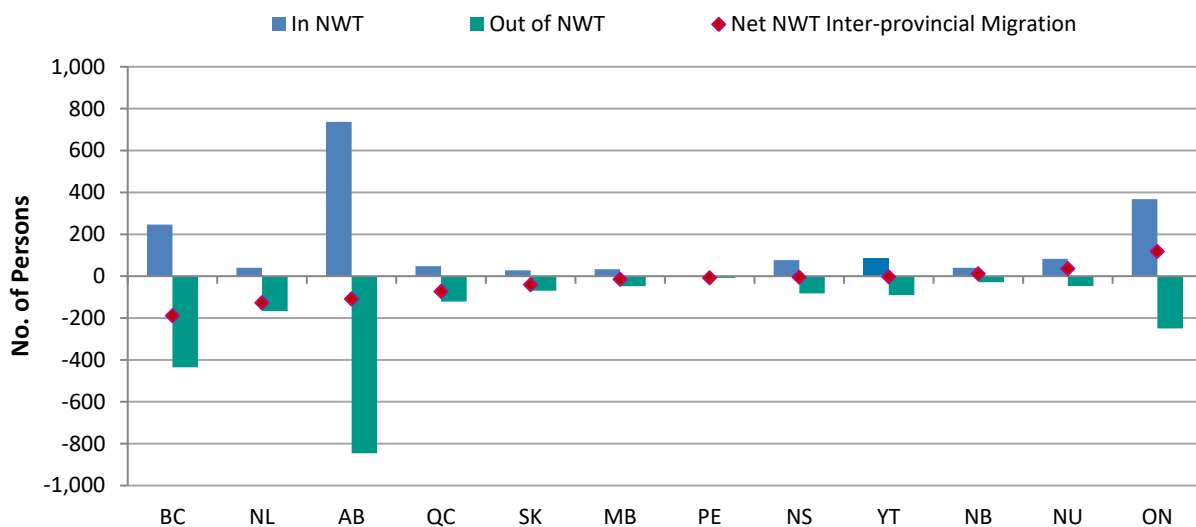


## Northwest Territories Population January 2026

On January 1, 2026 Statistics Canada estimated that 45,803 people were living in the Northwest Territories. Between January 1, 2025 and January 1, 2026, the population in the Northwest Territories increased by 124 persons (+0.3%). The components of natural increase during this one-year period consisted of 487 births and 285 deaths, resulting in a net increase of 202 persons. There was a net loss of 405 interprovincial migrants and a net gain of 327 international migrants.

Historically, Alberta has accounted for the largest number of interprovincial migrants both entering and exiting NWT. Between January 1, 2025 and January 1, 2026, 737 persons moved from Alberta, while 846 persons left for Alberta, resulting in the NWT’s third largest net loss of 109 interprovincial migrants. While both British Columbia and Newfoundland and Labrador had fewer persons moving to and from the NWT, both provinces contributed a larger net loss of interprovincial migrants to the NWT. Between January 1, 2025 and January 1, 2026, the NWT had a net loss of 189 people to British Columbia and 127 to Newfoundland and Labrador. In contrast, NWT had a net gain of 118 people from Ontario over the period (Figure 1).

At the national level, Canada's population decreased by 0.2% between January 1, 2025 and January 1, 2026, the first annual decrease since the beginning of comparable data series (1971). Alberta experienced the largest increase (1.2%), while most of the provinces and territories experienced small increases compared to the previous years. British Columbia and Ontario saw the largest population decline (both -0.7%), followed by Quebec and Newfoundland & Labrador (Table 1).
