

Northwest Territories Population October 2023

On October 1, 2023 Statistics Canada estimated that 44,760 people were living in the Northwest Territories. Between October 1, 2022 and October 1, 2023, the population in the Northwest Territories increased by 96 persons. The components of natural increase during this one-year period consisted of 502 births and 312 deaths, resulting in a net increase of 190 persons. There was a net loss of 669 interprovincial migrants and a net gain of 575 international migrants.

Historically, Alberta has accounted for the largest number of net inter-provincial migrants for the NWT. Between October 1, 2022 and October 1, 2023, 482 persons moved to the NWT from Alberta, while 1,118 persons moved from the territory to Alberta, resulting in the highest net loss of 636 persons among other provinces and territories. Ontario, on the other hand, made the largest contribution of new migrants to the Northwest Territories with a net gain of 103 persons (Figure 1).

At the national level, Canada's population increased by 3.2% between October 1, 2022 and October 1, 2023, the highest population growth rate observed for a 12-month period since the availability of comparable data (1971/1972). Alberta experienced the largest population increase followed by Prince Edward Island, Ontario, and British Columbia, all exceeding the national growth. In contrast, the NWT's growth rate was the lowest among other provinces and territories.
