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## Consumer Price Index April 2024

Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index in April rose by 1.0% compared to one year ago. By comparison, annual prices increased by 2.7% for Canada, 2.8% for Edmonton, 1.8% for Whitehorse and 1.1% for Igaluit.


Since peaking in June 2022, the year-over-year inflation rate for Yellowknife has trended downward and slowed to just 1.0%; the lowest rate since the May 2021.

Between April 2023 and April 2024, Yellowknife consumer prices rose in five of the eight major components including food (2.4%), shelter (3.7%) and Health & Personal Care (4.6%).


Looking at energy and its components, fuel oil and other fuels decreased by 9.8% over the last year, while gasoline fell by 3.1%. In contrast, electricity prices rose 2.0% between April 2023 and April 2024.

Between April 2023 and April 2024, prices increased in all provinces ranging from 0.4% in Manitoba to 3.1% in Nova Scotia.
