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## Consumer Price Index April 2025

Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index in April rose by 2.7% compared to one year ago. By comparison, annual prices increased by 1.7% for Canada, 1.5% for Edmonton, 3.6% for Whitehorse, and 1.0% for Iqaluit.


Consumer prices increased for all provinces in April 2025 compared to a year ago. New Brunswick had the lowest increase (0.2%) while Quebec had the highest (2.2%).

In Yellowknife, year-over-year consumer prices rose in five of the eight major components including food (5.7%), and shelter (5.4%).

Prices for numerous grocery store items increased year-over-year, including meat and fruit & nuts. Food from restaurants increased by 8.2% between April 2024 and April 2025.

Looking at energy and its components, both gasoline and fuel oil & other fuels decreased by 10.3% and 5.4% respectively over the last 12 months. In contrast, electricity increased by 17.8% over the same period.

### Percentage Change in Food by Subcomponent Yellowknife, April 2024 to April 2025


