Consumer Price Index – August 2015

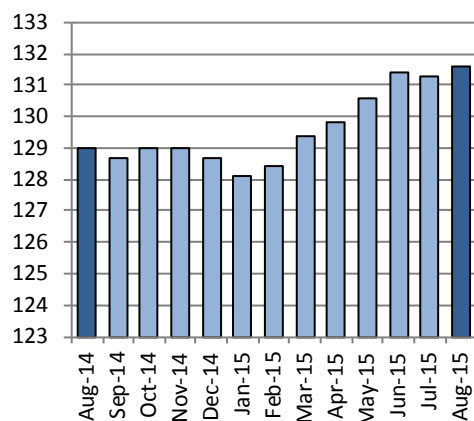
Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates that the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index rose 2.0% compared to one year ago. By comparison, the annual price increase was 1.3% for Canada, 1.9% for Edmonton, and 0.7% in Whitehorse.

Compared to August 2014, consumer prices increased in Yellowknife for most major components with the exception of shelter. Higher prices for food from stores (6.0%) and household furnishings (5.3%) were offset by lower prices for water, fuel & electricity (-6.3%).

Comparing August 2015 with July 2015, overall prices in Yellowknife increased by 0.2%. Prices rose for most major components over the last month with the exception of transportation and food. Shelter component remained unchanged.

CPI values for Yellowknife and Whitehorse include estimates of price changes for owned accommodation based on the price of rental accommodation. As a result, the all-items indexes published for these centres are not strictly comparable to those for Canada and Edmonton.
