

# Consumer Price Index

August 2016

## OVERVIEW

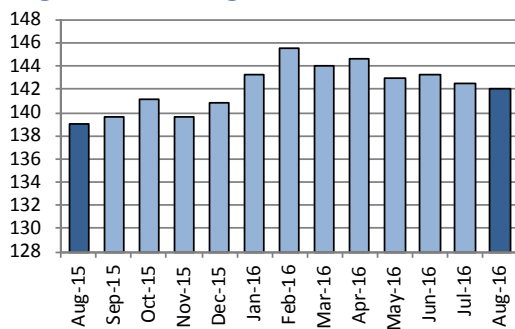
Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates that the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index in August rose 0.4% compared to one year ago. By comparison, the annual price increase was 1.1% for Canada, 0.7% for Edmonton, 0.3% for Whitehorse and 3.0% for Iqaluit.

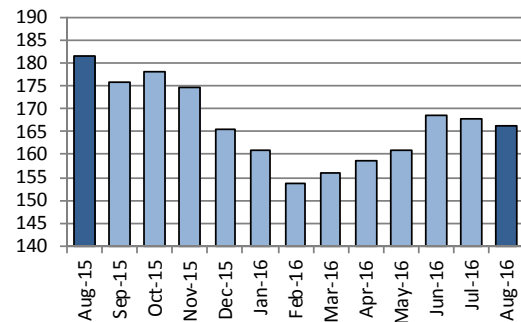

Compared to August 2015, prices varied by major components with half decreasing and half increasing over the one year period. Food contributed to the increase, rising by 2.2% while energy products fell by 8.5% since August 2015. While the price of food is higher than 12 months ago, it has steadily declined since February 2016. In contrast, the price of energy products have increased since February.

On a monthly basis, the overall Yellowknife index decreased for the second month in a row, declining by 0.2% between July and August 2016. Higher prices for household operations & furnishings and recreation, education & reading were offset by decreases in many of the other components.
