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## Consumer Price Index - August 2018 -


Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates that the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index in August rose by 3.3% compared to one year ago. By comparison, the annual price increase was 2.8% for Canada, 3.4% for Edmonton, 3.9% for Whitehorse and 4.4% for Iqaluit.

## ALL-ITEMS CONSUMER PRICE INDEX (2002=100)

Compared to August 2017, prices increased in Yellowknife for most major components with the exception of household operations & furnishings, and clothing & footwear. Transportation contributed to the increase, rising by 8.7% while energy products rose by 13.4%.

Energy prices have steadily increased over the last 12 months, a result of higher prices for fuel oil and other fuels (22.7%) and gasoline (26.8%), partially offset by lower prices for electricity (-2.1%). While every jurisdiction in Canada has experienced an increase in energy prices since August 2017, the rise has been most pronounced in the Alberta, Manitoba and Saskatchewan.
