## Consumer Price Index - August 2019 -


Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates that the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index in August rose by 1.8% compared to one year ago. By comparison, the annual price increase was 1.9% for Canada, 1.3% for Edmonton, 2.4% for Whitehorse and 1.8% for Iqaluit.

## ALL-ITEMS CONSUMER PRICE INDEX (2002=100)


Between August 2018 and August 2019, Yellowknife consumer prices increased for most major components with the exception of household operations and furnishings, which remained the same compared to 12 month ago. Food and transportation contributed to the overall annual increase, rising by 3.2% and 2.9% respectively.

Despite monthly fluctuations over the last 12 months, Yellowknife food prices have trended upward over this period. In contrast, transportation prices have consistently risen since January 2019, most recently increasing by 0.6% between July and August 2019. This monthly increase was a result of higher prices for public transportation, which includes airline travel, being partially offset by a decline in private transportation. Gasoline, which is a sub-component of private transportation, decreased by 2.1% between July and August 2019.
