Consumer Price Index

August 2023

Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index in August rose by 3.7% compared to one year ago. By comparison, annual prices increased by 4.0% for Canada, 4.2% for Edmonton, 4.6% for Whitehorse and 1.9% for Iqaluit.



While food prices in Yellowknife have trended upward for most of the last 2 years, they have stabilized since March. Despite this, food prices increased by 10.7% between August 2022 and August 2023. Food prices went up across various grocery store items such as fruit & nuts (19.4%), dairy & eggs (16.8%), and bakery & cereal (16.2%). Food from restaurants increased by 7.0% over the same period.

In addition to food, other components such as health & personal care (6.4%), and shelter (4.9%) also contributed to the overall increase, fully offsetting the 7.4% decline in household operations and furnishings between August 2022 and August 2023.

At the provincial level, consumer prices increased in all jurisdictions between August 2022 and August 2023. Manitoba had the lowest increase (3.2%), while Nova Scotia had the highest (4.7%).

Percentage Change in Prices - All Items August 2022 to August 2023


