Consumer Price Index December 2019

Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates that the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index in December rose by 1.6% compared to one year ago. By comparison, the annual price increase was 2.2% for Canada, 2.3% for Edmonton, 2.6% for Whitehorse and 1.4% for Iqaluit.

Between December 2018 and December 2019, Yellowknife consumer prices increased for most major components with the exception of household operations & furnishings and clothing and footwear. Shelter experienced the largest increase over the 12-month period, rising by 3.1% between December 2018 and December 2019. Year over year increases in water, fuel and electricity contributed to the higher shelter prices.

Figure 1 Calendar Year Inflation Rate (Jan - Dec) Canada & Yellowknife, 2000 to 2019




Figure 1 shows how prices change from one year to the next based on the 12-month average index. Businesses tend to use this rate for the calendar year (January to December) to adjust salaries or evaluate the prices of their goods and services.

In 2019, the calendar year inflation rate for Yellowknife was 1.6%, dropping from 2.3% in the previous year. In comparison, the Canadian inflation rate decreased to 1.9% in 2019 from 2.3% in 2018.
