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Consumer Price Index - February 2018 -


Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates that the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index in February rose by 1.8% compared to one year ago. By comparison, the annual price increase was 2.2% for Canada, 2.3% for Edmonton, 2.0% for Whitehorse and 2.0% for Iqaluit.

ALL-ITEMS CONSUMER PRICE INDEX (2002=100)



Compared to February 2017, prices increased in Yellowknife for most major components with the exception of household operations & furnishings, and recreation, education & reading. Shelter experienced the largest increase, rising by 4.3% over the last 12 months. Part of the increase in shelter can be attributed to the recent rise in fuel oil and other fuels.

Fuel oil & other fuels in Yellowknife increased by 22.4% between February 2017 and February 2018, with all of the increase occurring over the last five months. While all jurisdictions have experienced increases over this time, the rise has been more pronounced in Yellowknife.
