

Consumer Price Index February 2024

Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index in February rose by 1.7% compared to one year ago. By comparison, annual prices increased by 2.8% for Canada, 4.2% for Edmonton, 2.5% for Whitehorse and 3.1% for Iqaluit.



Between February 2023 and February 2024, Yellowknife consumer prices rose in four of the eight major components including food (3.6%) and shelter (5.7%). The increase in shelter was largely a result of higher prices for fuel oil and other fuels (7.4%), while the rise in food stemmed from a variety of grocery store items including dairy & eggs, vegetables, and fruit & nuts.


Transportation also rose over the period as an increase in purchasing and leasing of vehicles was partially offset by a decrease in public transportation (airlines). Annual declines were also observed for household operations & furnishings (-5.9%), clothing & footwear (-3.0%), recreation, education & reading (-0.2%) and health & personal care (-0.1%)

Between February 2023 and February 2024, prices increased in all provinces ranging from 0.9% in Manitoba to 4.2% in Alberta.
