
Consumer Price Index - January 2019 -

Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates that the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index in January rose by 1.0% compared to one year ago. By comparison, the annual price increase was 1.4% for Canada, 1.2% for Edmonton, 1.6% for Whitehorse and 1.7% for Iqaluit.

Between January 2018 and January 2019, Yellowknife consumer prices increased for most components with the exception of transportation. Food contributed to the increase rising by 2.3% while energy products declined by 5.0%. The annual decline in energy prices was a result of decreases in fuel oil and other fuels (10.9%), gasoline (2.7%) and electricity (0.3%), with all of the decline occurring over the last two months. In contrast, food prices have fluctuated over the last 7 months, most recently increasing by 1.9% between December 2018 and January 2019. This increase was offset by monthly decreases in many of the other components, resulting in an overall Yellowknife price decline of 0.7% between December 2018 and January 2019.
