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## Consumer Price Index - July 2018 -


Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates that the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index in July rose by 3.3% compared to one year ago. By comparison, the annual price increase was 3.0% for Canada, 3.8% for Edmonton, 3.7% for Whitehorse and 4.5% for Iqaluit.

## ALL-ITEMS CONSUMER PRICE INDEX (2002=100)

Compared to July 2017, prices increased in Yellowknife for most major components with the exception of household operations & furnishings, and clothing & footwear. Transportation experienced the largest increase, rising by 9.0% over the last 12 months. Part of the increase in transportation is attributed to the 23.4% increase in public transportation which includes airline travel. Shelter also rose between July 2017 and July 2018, mostly a result of higher prices for water, fuel and electricity.





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oil and other fuels increased by 24.4% while gasoline rose 26.0% over the last year. The increase in gasoline was not unique to Yellowknife as all jurisdictions experienced a large increase between July 2017 and July 2018.
